Spirited - Taking Paganism Beyond the Circle by Gede Parma

An excellent guide giving crucial advice on witchcraft, spellcraft ethics, coven and solitary work and incorporating one's spiritual beliefs into all the important areas of life. Gede was our Guest Guide in 2010 for the duration of both the West Country and Irish tours.

Britain BC by Francis Pryor

A fabulous book examining life in Britain before the coming of the Romans including information about the great monuments of Stonehenge, Avebury and West Kennet Long Barrow, Silbury Hill and Windmill Hill in England and Newgrange and Navan Fort in Ireland.

Avebury - Sun, Moon and Earth by Maria Wheatley and Busty Taylor

Researcher's Maria and Busty have written a book highlighting their beliefs that the ancient architects of Avebury were very aware of the earth's whispering energies and subtle geometries and integrated them into the foundation plans of the monuments using their esoteric knowledge.
